SESSION B OF USDF 'L' PROGRAM SET FOR JANUARY; NEXT SESSION SCHEDULED TO OCCUR IN MAY

SCDCTA is proudly hosting the USDF L Continuing Education Program for those aspiring to be dressage judges. Session B (Judging Criteria for Gaits and Paces) will be held Jan. 18-19 in Aiken.

Jayne Ayers, an S judge from Wisconsin, will be the instructor for this session. The classroom session will be held 8am-5pm on Saturday, Jan. 18 at Aiken Technical College, 2276 Jefferson Davis Hwy., Aiken, SC.

The following day, Sunday, Jan. 19, will feature the mounted session, held 8am-5pm at Breezy Hill Farm South, 263 Boyd Pond Road, Beech Island, SC. Lunch is included both days.

Auditor space is available for \$50/day (SCDCTA members pay \$75 for both days), so join us for this exceptional opportunity! Auditors will learn more about horse and rider biomechanics, as well as what judges are looking for, and will come away with a clearer understanding of what those

comments on dressage tests really mean. Auditing fees must be received two weeks before the session begins, so get yours in today!

Demo riders also are needed for this and future sessions. Riders need to be able to demonstrate test movements and/or ride full tests at Training, First, or Second Level. Participation as a demo rider counts for SCDCTA volunteer hours. Demo riders also get lunch and a gift, plus great feedback from the experienced judges acting as L program instructors.

Session C of the program (Collective Marks and Rider Biomechanics) will be held May 9-10, 2020. Kathy Rowse will be the instructor for this session.

SCDCTA JUNIOR DRESSAGE CLINIC PROGRAM WINS USDF "CREATIVE PROGRAM" AWARD

SCDCTA is proud to announce that its free junior dressage clinic program has won a newly established USDF award, that for the best Creative GMO-Sponsored program.

The USDF weighed submitted programs based on three categories: innovation, service to membership, and promotional value to the GMO. One judge, Anne Sushko, awarded the SCDCTA junior program a perfect score of 60 out of 60 possible points; the second judge, Diane Holston, gave the program a score of 55.

Under this program, SCDCTA junior riders fundraise and solicit sponsors to provide an annual free clinic with a well-known dressage trainer for junior riders. The three-day clinic includes two lessons. stabling. educational lectures and fun swag participants. The cost for the clinic-paid for entirely from the efforts of the SCDCTA junior members—generally runs about \$4,000-6,000. Among the kids' usual fundraising efforts are bake sales, lemonade stands, and raffles in conjunction with SCDCTA's recognized shows. They also sell custom-embroidered vests and coolers, supported by a longstanding relationship with SC Embroidery and in 2019, sold holiday cards.

Former junior coordinator Jill Allard created this novel program several years ago; Kathryn Butt, the current junior coordinator, has continued to run it and help the participating kids with fundraising ideas and execution.

Riders are selected based on completion of eight volunteer hours with SCDCTA events and applications that must be completed and submitted to SCDCTA's junior coordinator by a date set well in advance of the clinic. SCDCTA We have never turned away a rider with a complete, on-time application that has fulfilled all volunteer hours!

"We feel that it is important for the kids to learn to give back to the sport, and it helps them make friends and connections while appreciating show volunteers," Butt explained. "The application process is implemented to receive a head count on who is attending and to give the children practice at applications. Whether they go on to apply for colleges or The Dressage Foundation grants, the application process is an important one that we at SCDCTA wish to foster."

The 2019 clinic, with Pan American Team member Endel Ots, was held at the Camden Equestrian Center. Previous clinicians have included Mary-Cameron Rollins, Scott Peterson and Jodie Kelly.

The clinics begin with a meet-and-greet pizza party on Friday evening. Breakfast and lunch are served on Saturday and Sunday, and Saturday evening is capped off with a barbecue affair. Meals during the clinics often are sponsored by the parents of some of the participating juniors. Lessons take place on Saturday and Sunday, along with scheduled educational lectures by equine professionals like veterinarians, farriers, and nutritionists.

The kids are expected to watch one another's rides with a notebook in hand to write down exercises, advice, and any questions they may have for the clinician during breaks. Cell phones must be silenced and left on the rail.

"Clinicians like these provide real-life advice covering not only riding and training tips, but suggestions for navigating the rest of a dressage rider's life," said Wendy Robinson—a parent of an active junior and long-time SCDCTA member and volunteer herself—in a letter to the USDF about the program. "As the event has grown, it has provided tangible benefits to many SCDCTA young riders. Several participants have qualified and competed on a regional and national level


including Region 3, and Region 1 Championships, as well as national competitions such as The US Dressage Festival of Champions at Lamplight."

"As a junior, I receive constant support from an incredible equestrian community and access to tools that prepare me for my equestrian career," agreed junior Jessica Gregory in a letter to the USDF supporting nomination of the clinic program for the award. "Attending the yearly clinic, is an educational experience that I look forward to every year. The friendships built with my fellow juniors will last long into my future and I am grateful for the welcoming community everyone creates."

In addition to the great educational opportunity, participating riders get bags of fun swag, including sponsored items like Nickerdoodle horse treats, Vetrolin liniment, and gift cards to local SC tack shops. Part of the annual budget goes to one big swag item for the riders; in 2019, the kids raised enough money to give directors' chairs to the riders. Past years have featured collared shirts and saddle pads with the SCDCTA logo.

A thank-you note station is set up for the entire clinic, and participating riders are required to write at least two notes thanking sponsors, parents, or the clinician before the weekend is over.

To further benefit all SC dressage riders, auditors of all ages are welcome at the junior clinics. Juniors may audit for free; adults who are not parents or guardians of participating junior riders are asked to make a donation of their choice to the fund for the following year's clinic.

HOLIDAY SCHOOLING SHOW HELD IN CAMDEN; SCHOOLING SHOW CHAMPIONSHIP IN THE WORKS

SCDCTA recently held its inaugural holiday schooling show, graciously hosted by Pine Tree Stables (Camden). Both combined tests and straight dressage classes were included; the show featured special ribbons for the lowest-scoring CT rider and highest-scoring dressage rider, as well as division awards with prizes from The Tack Room (Camden).

Lauren Rosati, aboard Charging Bull, took home the CT low score ribbon for a score of 25.6 at the Amoeba level; the dressage high score ribbon went to Mary Bontreger and Wedekind for their score of 73.857% at First Level. Division winners at the show were:

NEW QUALIFYING SCORES, VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL MEMBERS SEEKING YEAR-END AWARDS

There have been some changes made to SCDCTA's year-end award program starting with the current competition year.

As announced last year, members must earn a median score of 57% to qualify for a year-end award at any level of dressage; this applies to both schooling and recognized shows. For musical freestyle awards, the minimum qualifying median will be 62%.

Additionally, members must contribute at least eight volunteer hours per competition year to qualify for year-end awards (*see form, Page 10*). These hours can be earned at any time throughout the year at any SCDCTA-sponsored event, including SCDCTA-recognized schooling shows, or at any recognized dressage show.

These are not the only volunteer opportunities available; volunteer hours may be earned by helping as demo riders or in other capacities at clinics and by doing behind-the-scenes work to support things like the newsletter and the annual banquet.

Members who truly cannot spare time may designate another to volunteer in their stead.

As always, riders must be SCDCTA members in good standing by the end of the competition year for scores from that year to count toward annual awards. Horses must also be registered.
